Q - What is the diffrence between this game and original "Lemuria: Lost in Space"? A - VR edition is remastered in many ways and now it contains:

Q - My HTC Vive controllers are not working. A - Turn off the game, go to SteamVR and make sure that controllers are on. Then start the game again.

I only have this DLC because the Steam winter sale price of entire game was less than \$10. That depreciation though. Good things come to those who wait.. This is one of those games that I didn't really *get* when I first heard about it or saw it around and was probably going to skip it over, but heard more about it on the Voices of VR podcast so decided to give it a try and am really happy that I did. Simple, yet challenging and completely engrossing. Spent about a half hour playing and will definitely be going back trying to improve my score. Great amount of fun for the money.. This is an excellent and criminally overlooked roguelite. The use of hyperbolic space is truly unique and not just visual flair: it really impacts the gameplay and some crazy stuff is possible that wouldn't be in normal Euclidean space. The graphics are barebones and won't impress most, but considering this is a one-man labor of love I think they do a great job. Well worth the full price, but if you want to try it first, a slightly outdated version is offered free on the creator's site.. This game isnt really bad, but my gaming experience was worse because of bugs I stombled upon. I won half of the levels because of those bugs, sometimes I lost just because of them.

Think to die is not that expensive, though I would recommend getting it only while it is on sale.. Royal Defense is an enjoyable tower defence game that somewhat tries to be a Kingdom Rush clone. Although it's not as good as Kingdom Rush it's not a bad game.

Pros:

- invisible enemies force you to build radar towers
- magic attacks that reload in time or can be purchased for gems
- option to pause
- add or upgrade towers in pause mode
- call magical attack in pause mode
- two times speed
- some enemies are immune to certain type of attacks, which enriches the strategy level
- walking and flying enemies
- enemy magicians can temporarily deactivate your towers
- some enemies produce new enemies
- option to manually direct fire on a specific enemy

Neutral:

- only four type of towers (arrow, cannon, mortar, money tower)

Cons:

- DLC is better than the main game

The story centers around Fenton Paddock, our protagonist. With a name fit for a rascal, he appears quite flippant but not in an offensive way due to his copious amount of boyish charm. The rest of the cast is also interesting, each with a rich backstory and distinct motivations. And the voice acting is spot on!

But the great beauty of this game is the sense of adventure it exudes. The progression of the story makes so much sense and the places you go (or end up) are diverse, beautifully crafted and presented, with an almost magical allure; from the Governor's mansion in Hong Kong, to the Himalayas and the streets of Marrakech. The various maps of each area are a nice touch, adding to the game's adventurous nature.
